



## Thackley Primary School PE and Sports Grant for Academic Year 2021/22

**Purpose of Funding** (taken from DfE website) Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of the PE, sport and physical activity they provide. This means that you must use the PE and sport premium to:

- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now are sustainable and will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
- develop or add to the PE, sport and physical activity that your school provides

**Sustainable improvement** Making sustainable improvements should be considered as a priority. This is often achieved through developing and investing in the knowledge and skills of the teaching staff and other school staff who may have involvement in supporting a lasting change to the school's approach to physical activity, curriculum PE or provision of school sport

1. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
2. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity

5. Increased participation in competitive sport

**Basis of Allocation** Allocations for the academic year 2021 to 2022 are calculated using the number of pupils in years 1 to 6, as recorded in the January 2021 census, as follows:

- schools with 17 or more pupils receive £16,000 plus £10 per pupil
- schools with 16 or fewer pupils receive £1,000 per pupil

For Thackley Primary School this is based on 360 pupils – and therefore a total allocation of **£19,600** (£16,000 + £10 x 360).

## Impact statement:

### Impact for 2021 / 2022

Through the government sports grant, at Thackley we are able to provide the following for our children:

- Wider sporting opportunities for all children – including wider curriculum sports such as dodgeball, tri-golf, ultimate Frisbee and handball.
- Specialised curriculum teaching in Year groups from Year 1 to 6
- Additional after school sports for all year groups from year 1 to 6.
- Through membership contribution to the LAP sports, children from years 1-6 again had the chance to participate in a sporting festival against other schools and received additional specialist teaching in preparation for the festivals. These included competitions such as Multi – Sports, Ultimate Frisbee, and Netball.
- Additional equipment purchased enables more focused skill development. A whole class set of equipment ensures maximum participation. Whole class sets of Footballs, Rugby and Multi Sport balls were purchased this year.
- Enable many more of our children to attend competitions on a regular basis through the Hanson Schools Games competition group. These were initially impacted with the Pandemic but opportunities became more regular in 2022.
- Enable many more of our children to attend competitions on a regular basis through the Sports UK Festival Days such as the football World Cup and Rugby World Cup. Thackley Primary were winners of both these events.
- Specialist Sports Coaches supporting children during their lunchtime playtimes maximises opportunities for skills to be taught outside of PE lessons. All Keys Stage One and Two children have access to a qualified Sports Coach EVERY lunchtime.
- Sports UK Play Leaders programme ensured our older children in school are trained to work with the younger children during lunchtime playtimes.

As a result of increased knowledge, skills and understanding in PE:

- Teachers took part in a specialised training programme adapted to their own areas of need. Majority of teachers expressed that Gymnastics and Dance were the topics where they needed the most training. Teachers planned, delivered and evaluated lessons alongside experienced coaches over a half term period. Teachers reported this helped immensely with their confidence and knowledge.
- Extra coaching/teaching staff have been employed to share responsibility for some clubs due to over subscription. Teaching assistants work alongside sports coaches to deliver after school sessions.
- The uptake in extra curricular sporting activities has increased again and all clubs continue to run at full capacity. Over the academic year these clubs have included:

- Football
- Girls Football
- Cricket
- Fitness

- Teachers have expressed an increase in confidence when teaching PE due to higher skill levels acquired from professional coaches.
- Teachers are provided with planning for PE lessons which enables them to deliver lessons with more confidence. Teachers have expressed an increase in confidence when teaching unknown sports/subjects due to the PE planning package.
- HLTA and cover supervisors are also more able to support PE lessons with confidence
- Competition enthusiasm has increased; all competitions are celebrated in front of the whole school.
