



## Thackley Primary School PE and Sports Grant for Academic Year 2023/24

**Purpose of Funding** Schools should use the PE and sport premium funding to help achieve these aims. It must not be used for core-type school activities. They should use it to make additional and sustainable improvements to the PE, sport and physical activity they provide, such as:

- funding high-quality PE and sport for at least 2 hours a week, complemented by a wide range of extracurricular sport and competitive opportunities
- providing or improving equal access to sport for boys and girls

Schools should prioritise PE and sport premium spending to improve in the following 5 key areas:

- increasing all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport
- increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport
- raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement
- offer a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils
- increase participation in competitive sport

Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils they have in years 1 to 6. In cases where schools may not have set year groups (for example, in some special schools), pupils aged 5 to 10 attract the funding.

In most cases, we determine funding by using data from the January 2023 school census. For a new school, or a school teaching eligible pupils for the first time in the academic year 2023 to 2024, funding is based on data from the autumn 2023 school census.

For the year 2023 to 2024, the amounts payable will be:

- schools with 16 or fewer eligible pupils will receive £1,000 per pupil
- schools with 17 or more eligible pupils will receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil

For Thackley Primary School this is based on 359 pupils – and therefore a total allocation of **£19,590** (£16,000 + £10 x 359).

**Impact for 2023 / 2024 Through the government sports grant, at Thackley we are able to provide the following for our children:**

Wider sporting opportunities for all children – including wider curriculum sports such as dodgeball, tri-golf, ultimate Frisbee and handball.

There has been a positive impact in the number of children engaging in physical activity out of school. Children are more aware of how 60 minutes (30minutes in school and 30 minutes out of school) physical activity daily can benefit you psychologically and physiologically. Children's achievements outside of school are celebrated in assemblies.

Specialised curriculum teaching in Year groups from Year N to 6

PE Lead works closely with PE leaders at Idle Primary and Blakehill Primary and has increased opportunities to engage and compete against these schools. Building links with local schools has increased participation in sports by larger numbers of pupils. 45 children attended the recent Cross Country competition at Blakehill Primary!

Additional after school sports for all year groups from year 1 to 6. Reception in the summer term.

Through membership contribution to the BEOP sports, children from years 1-6 again had the chance to participate in a sporting festival against other schools and received additional specialist teaching in preparation for the festivals. These included competitions such as Multi – Sports, Ultimate Frisbee, and Netball.

Additional equipment purchased enables more focused skill development. A whole class set of equipment ensures maximum participation. Whole class sets of Footballs, Rugby and Multi Sport balls were replenished this year.

Enable many more of our children to attend competitions on a regular basis through the Hanson Schools Games competition group plus many other competitions this year.

Enable many more of our children to attend competitions on a regular basis through the Sports UK Festival Days such as the football World Cup and Rugby World Cup.

Specialist Sports Coaches supporting children during their lunchtime playtimes maximises opportunities for skills to be taught outside of PE lessons. All Keys Stage One and Two children have access to a qualified Sports Coach EVERY lunchtime.

The uptake in extra curricular sporting activities has increased again and all clubs continue to run at full capacity. Over the academic year these clubs have included: - Football - Girls Football – PE Games - Dance

Teachers have expressed an increase in confidence when teaching PE due to higher skill levels acquired from professional coaches.

Teachers are provided with planning for PE lessons which enables them to deliver lessons with more confidence. Teachers have expressed an increase in confidence when teaching unknown sports/subjects due to the PE planning package.

HLTA and cover supervisors are also more able to support PE lessons with confidence

Competition enthusiasm has increased; all competitions are celebrated in front of the whole school and on social media.

Thackley Primary has an excellent reputation for Sport in the local community and many of our families mention this when they come to look around school for Reception intakes.

The PE lead has close links with Thackley Football Club and Thackley Cricket club which enables the use of their grounds when activities require a larger area. E.g. Sports Day.
