Superhero Card







#### You will need: card or paper and colouring equipment.

- 1. Take your paper or card and place it horizontally in front of you. Grab each end of the paper and fold them until they meet in the middle. Then crease the edges.
- 2. Then take the top 2 corners that meet in the middle and fold them back to form the shirt collar; crease well so they lay flat.
- 3. Decorate it to look like a shirt. Add on buttons or a tie if you like.
- 4. Next, draw or stick a superhero image (such as Superman's S) inside the card in the middle, making sure it cannot be seen peeking out of the collar when the "shirt" is closed.
- 5. Finally, write a loving message inside the card around the superhero image. This could be about why the recipient is a hero for you. Perhaps they make you delicious food or helped you master a new skill or make you feel really safe when they give you a cuddle. Make sure it is a personal and detailed as your loved ones are sure to most appreciate a thoughtful message from you where you tell them what you love about them and what you most appreciate from your time together.
