PE and Sports Grant for Academic Year 2017/18

Purpose of Funding (taken from DfE website)

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that you should use the premium to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- Make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

For example, you can use your funding to:

- Hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- Provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- Introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- Support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- Run sport competitions
- Increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- Run sports activities with other schools

Basis of Allocation

Allocations for the academic year 2016/17 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6, as recorded in the January census as follows:

Schools with 17 or more pupils receive **£16000** plus **£10** per pupil: and

Schools with 16 or fewer pupils receive £1000 per pupil

For our school this is based on 360 pupils – and therefore a total allocation of £19,600 (£16,000 + £10 x 360).

This annual amount will be paid in two stages, with 7/12 for the autumn and spring terms paid in November 2017, and 5/12 for the summer term paid in May 2018

Impact statement:

Impact for 2017 / 2018

Through the government sports grant, at Thackley we are able to provide the following for our children:

- Wider sporting opportunities for all children – including wider curriculum sports such as dodgeball, tri-golf, ultimate Frisbee and handball.
- Specialised curriculum teaching in Year groups from Year 1,2,3,5 & 6.
- Additional after school sports for all year groups from year 1 to 6.

- Through membership contribution to the LAP sports, children from years 1-6 again had the chance to participate in a sporting festival against other schools and received additional specialist teaching in preparation for the festivals. These included competitions such as Multi – Sports, Ultimate Frisbee, and Netball.
- Additional equipment purchased enables more focused skill development. A whole class set of equipment ensures maximum participation. Whole class sets of Footballs, Tri-golf and Handball were purchased this year.
- Enable many more of our children to attend competitions on a weekly and regular basis through the Hanson Schools Games competition group. Competitions such as U11 football, U9 football, and U11 tag rugby were attended this year.
- Enable many more of our children to attend competitions on a regular basis through the Fisical Sports Schools Games competition group. Thackley were the Fisical U11 Football champions this year.
- Specialist Sports Coaches supporting children during their lunchtime playtimes maximises opportunities for skills to be taught outside of PE lessons. All Keys Stage One and Two children have access to a qualified Sports Coach EVERY lunchtime.
- Sports UK Play Leaders programme ensured our older children in school are trained to work with the younger children during lunchtime playtimes.

As a result of increased knowledge, skills and understanding in PE:

- Extra coaching/teaching staff have been employed to share responsibility for some clubs due to over subscription. Teaching assistants work alongside sports coaches to deliver after school sessions.
- The uptake in extra curricular sporting activities has increased again and all clubs continue to run at full capacity. Over the academic year these clubs have included:
 - Football
 - Gymnastics
 - Street Dance
 - Netball
 - Rounders
- Teachers have expressed an increase in confidence when teaching PE due to higher skill levels acquired from professional coaches.
- Teachers are provided with planning for PE lessons which enables them to deliver lessons with more confidence. Teachers have expressed an increase in confidence when teaching unknown sports/subjects due to the PE planning package.
- HLTA and cover supervisors are also more able to support PE lessons with confidence
- Competition enthusiasm has increased; all competitions are celebrated in front of the whole school.

School Games Mark – GOLD AWARD

The School Games Mark is a government led awards scheme launched in 2012 to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community.

Each School Games Mark application is divided into four sets of questions. They cover the following basic topics...

- Participation - how many young people at your school are being engaged in sporting activity?
- Competition - how many different sports are being played and how many competitions are being entered?
- Workforce - how many pupils are involved in leadership activities alongside taking part in competitions?
- Clubs - how many local links does your school have with clubs or establishments from the area?
