- ★ Beach time at Staithes is one of our favourite activities. We can't be there but you could do some beach art. Can you paint, draw or sketch a beach scene?





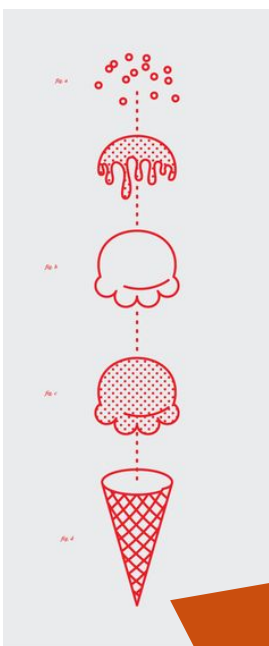
Day Two Whitby

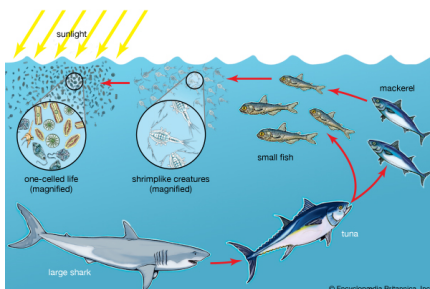
